Dear Friends,

This Advent season provides us with important opportunities to reach out to those in need through our two special mission offerings.

First, on Christmas Sunday, December 20, we shall give and receive the United Church of Christ Christmas Fund Special Mission Offering, which this year will re-claim its traditional name—“The Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund.” This offering is an expression of joy and gratitude to, and for, those who serve the church. Gifts to the Christmas Fund provide pension and health premium supplementation to low-income retirees, emergency assistance to the families of clergy and lay employees, and Christmas “Thank You” Gift Checks to hundreds of annuitants. The 2008 Christmas Fund provided assistance to nearly 1,500 individuals and families. Amid a depressed economic climate that continues to drag on, our gifts are needed more than ever to help the growing number of retirees whose low income annuities make it difficult to meet increasing living costs. Requests for Ministerial Assistance provided by the Christmas Fund are greater than at any point in recent history.

And then, on Christmas Eve, December 24, at 10:00 P.M., we shall take our special Christmas Offering to benefit our local Salvation Army. The outreach mission and ministries of this organization are familiar to us all—homeless shelter, soup kitchen, food pantry, emergency counseling, outreach to senior citizens and nursing home residents, and holiday toy and food baskets.
