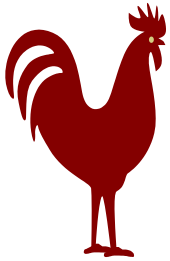

## **2<sup>ND</sup> HOUR, “LOOKING FORWARD”, MEETING**

We will be moving ahead, in earnest, in our search for your new, settled minister. To this end we will have our third “Looking Forward Meeting” after church and quick lunch on Sunday, September 27<sup>th</sup>. This will be a first attempt at visioning a future: What are the essentials for the church and in a settled minister? What would you hope for? Shortly after this meeting the Church Council will select a search committee who will hold more information-gathering meetings themselves. Then on Sunday, November 22<sup>nd</sup> The Rev. Michelle Hughes, Associate Conference Minister for Transitions, will preach and speak to us about the search process for a new settled minister.

## **GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR**

### **A LONG LINE OF MAGI**

With the fall season comes football, flaming foliage and leaf raking, Halloween and mulled cider, family at Thanksgiving and First Church's stewardship endeavor. To put it succinctly: Stewardship is the using and sharing of our possessions, time, and personality for the progress of God's Reign.

Let's flesh that out a bit. Every week we pray as Jesus taught us to pray, "Thy Kingdom come." Our stewardship of time, talent and treasure is the part we actively play, what we owe, and what we commit to back up our desire that God's way will hold ever greater sway in the world—that there will be less evil and more good, less hate and more love, less selfishness and more sharing. We work with God, allocating what we have, to cultivate God's values and hopes for our community of faith and for all of creation. Stewardship then is fundamentally a joyful endeavor that links us in the most intimate ways with God's purposes and gives profound meaning to our lives.

Who were the first Christian stewards? I imagine they were the Magi: those intrepid soul seekers who, upon discovering the baby Jesus, "bowed down and offered their treasures: gold, frankincense, and myrrh." Their discovery of the promised one, their humble worship of the divine child, and their sharing of what was most precious must have been a numinous experience for Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Imagine how thrilling that moment was when they laid their presents on the ground before the child of God. We do exactly the same when we make our pledges to First Church.

This year we are using the Pony Express Stewardship Program. It's fun, quick, easy, no pressure, and gives us a little bit of interaction with each other. We have divided our parish into 15 geographical areas, each with a Trail Boss in charge of a route of eight to ten individuals/families. The Trail Boss will read the stewardship material, consider their pledge and fill out the pledge card, seal it in an envelope and as soon as possible she or he will deliver it to the next person on the list. At the exchange, talking as fellow members is encouraged but not required.

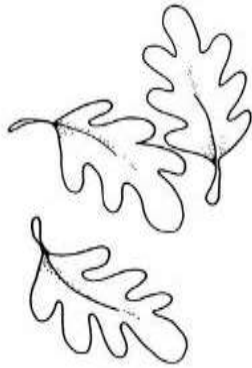
When you receive the saddle bag you will have two days to do the same . . . read the stewardship material, consider your pledge and fill out the pledge card, and place your sealed envelope in the completed side of the saddle bags. Please move the saddle bag on to the next family on the list within the two day time. This should take no longer than three weeks to finish. If you have any questions or are unable to move the saddle bag forward, please call your Trail Boss, as listed on the route sheet.

For those at a further distance, and a part of our family who has not pledged recently, a pledge card will be sent to you. We very much look forward to your response to help this joyful and loving church family.

2016 is an important year in the life of First Church. If you are able, and some of you are, I strongly encourage you to consider increasing your pledge. If you are not able, then share as you can. All pledging is kept confidential. All are equal in the sight of God; all are equal in the respect and love of this church.

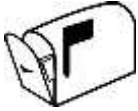

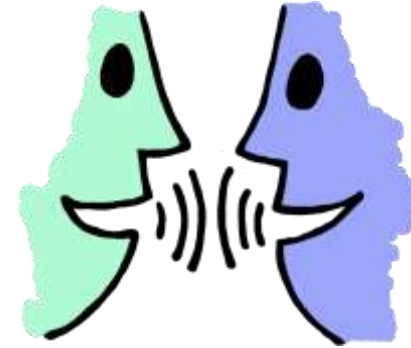
