## GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR

### COMUNION AT HOME

*Out of all times and places of our lives,  
We come to this sacred table and place

This is a beautiful "Invitation to Communion." Communion is one of two sacraments celebrated by the Protestant Church because Jesus expressly commands it: "Do this in remembrance of me."

What exactly a sacrament is, or what communion precisely means, is to many a mystery. The succinct definition of a sacrament is "a special means of grace." Like God's grace, communion is beyond words. It is an experience, and one that may be very different each time we receive it. What we do know is that in so many ways communion brings us closer to God and closer to one another.

Unfortunately, some in our faith community are unable to attend worship, with regularity or at all. Therefore, they miss out on the holy moment that is communion. Sunday sermons are printed each week and can be sent out on request, but sending bread and cup through the mail is not the same thing. **BEN GUCKEL'S HEART TRANSPLANT**

In December, Ben Guckel, great nephew of Bill and Lynne Furman, was an active 16 year old High School Junior from Somers, CT. In early January everything changed when Ben, who hadn't been feeling well, went to the doctor. The staff CCMC suspected that a virus had attacked his heart. After staying at Boston's Childrens' Hospital for a while, he is now home waiting for a new heart.

Heart transplants carry great risk and costs for surgery can be up to \$1 million. Anti-rejection drugs can cost up to \$2,500 a month. Even with good jobs and health insurance, there are enormous fees associated the illness. There will be a collection bucket in the Narthex and in Coffee Hour for anyone who would like to donate.
