## GREETINGS FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Professor Edwin S. Roberts of Princeton Seminary was surprised to hear a pastor conclude his announcements during Sunday worship with these words: "I am not going to take a vacation this summer: the Devil never does!" Roberts went home and re-read the Gospels to see what Jesus' attitude towards rest was. He discovered that of Jesus' three years of active ministry there are mentioned ten periods of retirement. That was in addition to his nightly rest and Sabbath rest.

Indeed, all of us have need for recreation. We are no different than Jesus who required time to rest his body, refresh his mind, strengthen his heart, and renew his relationship with God. I hope that all of you have made substantial plans for your refreshment this summer. Do so, knowing that it is necessary. Do so, knowing that you have God's blessings.

We all need to remember that one of the first things that gets left behind in the crisis of the day, in the rat race of our daily lives, is the nourishment our souls. Summer time should be soul time. I encourage you to make it so. Come to church seeking something new or visit a different church. Read one book of the Bible carefully, interacting and savoring one verse at a time. Use the time to begin a program of meditation. Begin your own ministry of care that only you and God know about. Summer is new possibility time. I stand ready to help you make this a spiritually profitable summer. Just give me a call or stop by the office and we'll work together to find something just right for you.

For now, I share this prayer with you.

Generous Lord, who brings us again to the summer with all its opportunity for dreaming and recreation, who sets us free to enjoy the soothing waters of your design, who freely offers the miracle of the wind for our pleasure and challenge, and who gives us the wit and wisdom of good friends to excite and comfort our souls; find in us now a rejoicing in all the tastes and sounds, all the flights and returnings, all the gatherings and quiet moments of summer so that we may be thankful for your gracious creation and this season of the soul. ### Thank you CE Committee and Church School Children

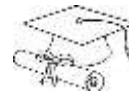

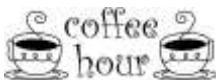

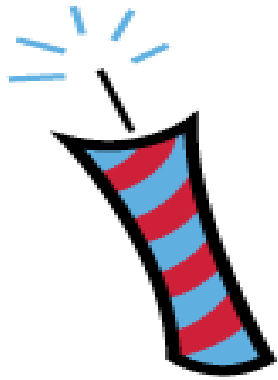
